

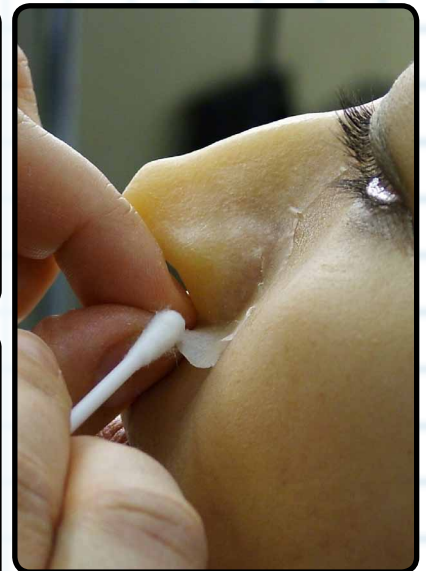
Applying Prosthetics- 15th May

Once everything is made, it's the final piece of the puzzle - sticking the rubber onto the skin and blending it in!

Appliances made with silicone or gelatine do a great job of behaving like real skin, as they are soft and translucent just like the real thing. Knowing how to handle, apply and colour pieces correctly is a great skill to have. Once you have the basics down, continued practice will be much easier and more successful.

Latex appliances are cheaper and easier to make, but require a particular approach to blend into skin, which we will look at too!

Knowing how to apply the right colours, how to deal with tricky edges and repairing things when they go wrong are all valuable things to know if you are going to be applying pieces you or somebody else has made.



The Applying Prosthetics Workshop is a one day hands-on practical class which covers the key skills and techniques required to apply and colour appliances effectively.

Areas covered include:

- Understanding how appliances are made.
- Identifying good and bad pieces.
- Adhesive types and selecting the right one.

- Dealing with perspiration.
- Repairing a bad edge.
